Background

- ICES first deployed in 1994 using available technology
- Deployed as a FoxPro application over Citrix Winframe
- Still running in this environment
- @40 sites using the system (out of 400)
- Birth cohort @43,000 children

The Challenge

- Undergoing acceptance testing for a new registry. Not sure test would be positive.
- Needed to provide additional reporting functionality to providers within current product framework.
- Wanted to limit investment but still enrich functionality.

Solution

- Contracted with HLN Consulting, LLC to develop a stand-alone reporting system
- Contracted through local AAP chapter
- Limited but necessary functionality
- Support for display and printing
- Read-only application
- Precise formatting requirements

System Architecture


- Visual Basic 5.0 wrapper for record selection and query via ODBC
- Call to MS-Access database which has report formats
- Data accessed from existing FoxPro files
- Winframe handles display and printing support.


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
Three Reports
